Written by the queen of murder/mystery plays, Agatha Christie, the action starts on a dark foggy night. A shot rings out and a stranger, Michael Starkwedder, comes in through the French windows to find a woman holding a gun and a dead man in a wheelchair. The dead man, Richard Warwick, turns out to have been a thoroughly unpleasant person. Between lying, making life miserable for his wife and shooting the neighbourhood cats, he had also managed to run over a child. However, that was in the past and the child's father is now dead so that he could have no connection with Warwick's death - or could he? Red herrings abound as Starkwedder sets about helping the obviously guilty wife save herself from the crime she's ready to admit to - but is she telling the truth? Chris Bassett and Ghislaine Bowden play Starkwedder and Laura Warwick with support from Cameron Arbuckle, Steve Bedford, Guy Hudson, Hilary Moore, Jonathan Tull, Alan Webber and Tricia Whyte. We have introduced the matinee so as to provide an opportunity for our younger members and those who do not like venturing out on dark evenings to come along and enjoy an afternoon's outing to the Theatre.
