Well, what a challenging start we had to 2010! Having had our pantomime rehearsals severely disrupted by the snow and ice before Christmas, we then faced more problems with the heavy snowfall which came just before the opening of our run of *Dick Whittington*. The resultant road conditions played havoc with our final rehearsals but with true determination and dedication the cast and crew overcame these problems and continued with the 10 performance run with almost all seats sold in advance. Unfortunately, because of the icy conditions, some people from farther afield were unable to take up their seats on the first weekend but throughout the run our audiences expressed their appreciation and enjoyment of the show. Tony Flook, of the Surrey Mirror, ended his glowing review by saying that the show "epitomised the best of pantomimes" - a fitting tribute to Janette, Sarah, Ieuan, Malcolm and everyone involved.

Having put panto to bed for another year, we are now busily preparing for our entries into the Southern Counties Drama Festival at the Barn Theatre. Our adult entry is *Alternative Accommodation* by Pam Valentine, directed by Tricia Whyte. This fast moving one act comedy is set in modern times when three adult children meet to decide what to do with their ageing mother. The play reflects upon a relevant social dilemma which affects most of us at one time or another. June Brown takes the part of the Mother, and Nigel Brown, Ghislaine Bowden and Mandie Arbuckle play her children. The play is being performed on Tuesday, 23 February 2010.

Our Youth Entry '*I in 56*' is the story of *Joshua Thompson*, who finds himself a prisoner of his own imagination when he falls into a coma. We follow him as he tumbles through his own memories and relives the moments that formed him as an individual. A moving and funny coming of age story with a twist in the tail, the play tackles many of the challenging themes concerning the fascinating process of growing up and discovering who you are. The cast comprises Faith Anderson, Marissa Beatty, Becca Filewood, Lotti Davies, Charlie Massey, Jamie Lewis and George Ewin and will be performed on Thursday 25 February 2010.
