

OPEN AUDITIONS

As reported in our previous issue of BTN, The Barnstormers will be returning to the Minack Theatre, Cornwall in May 2010 with their production of Andrew Lloyd Webber & Tim Rice's world famous rock opera 'Jesus Christ Superstar'.

The Barnstormers will be performing 'Jesus Christ Superstar' at the Minack Theatre in Porthcurno (www.minack.com) from Monday 31st May to Friday 4th June 2010. Shortly prior to this tour, there will be an opportunity for Barn supporters and friends to watch one of the planned dress rehearsals, to be staged at an open-air venue close to the Barn (more details in our next issue).

This is a tremendously exciting project and there's no doubt that the opportunity to perform this show in the spectacular setting of the Minack Theatre is definitely not to be missed. 'Jesus Christ Superstar' requires a large company of principals, chorus and dancers and the production team including Richard Allen (Producer), Neil Reynolds (Director), Ian Skipper (Musical Director) and Fran Reynolds (Choreographer) will be holding auditions (open to anyone 16 years and over) in September:-

PRINCIPALS AUDITIONS SUNDAY 6TH SEPTEMBER

VENUE: 'Little Barn' (located immediately behind the Barn Theatre). PRINCIPAL ROLES: Jesus, Judas, Mary, Pontius Pilate, Herod, Caiaphas, Annas, Peter & Simon (NOT those ONLY auditioning for the other Apostles, Priests and Soul Girls who need to come on Sunday 13th Sept - see below)

TIMES: 10.00am - 6.00pm. Each auditionee will be allocated a specific 5 min slot and should prepare (and bring along the sheet music to) an appropriate musical number from a show of their own choice, having regard to the musical styles within Jesus Christ Superstar. For example, those auditioning for Jesus and Judas should perform a number from a rock musical.

DANCERS & CHORUS AUDITIONS SUNDAY 13TH SEPTEMBER

VENUE: Orpheus Centre, North Park Lane, Godstone, Surrey. CALLED: All those auditioning for dancers (including Soul Girls) and chorus members (including all other Apostles & Priests not called to audition on Sun 6th September).

TIMES: 10.00am - 6.00pm. Dancers from 10.00am, Chorus etc from 2.00pm. All dancers will be required to sing and will therefore also be called to the afternoon session. No preparation is required, as the Musical Director will work with everyone on one of the chorus numbers from the show. All those auditioning for the chorus will also be required to undergo a movement audition.
