We ended our play season in May on a high note with *Habeas Corpus*, Alan Bennett's hilarious comedy. Under the direction of Peter Shore and with excellent performances by the cast of eleven including Peter Damesick, Janette White and Wendy O'Mahony, the play was described by reviewer Derrick Graham as "a brilliant play, superbly performed by The Oxted Players, realistically cast". We played to very full and appreciative audiences. We think it is fair to say that all the cast really enjoyed playing their respective characters and were grateful for the audience support. This play brought to end a season which was successful for us in both financial and entertainment terms.

Our AGM on 21 July saw the departure from our Committee of three long serving members, one of whom, Tony Goddard, has been on the Committee for 25 years as Treasurer, and he felt he deserved a rest! We also said a fond farewell to Pippa Bridges and David Fanthorpe. Their hard work and dedication over the years has been very much appreciated. In their place we welcome our new Treasurer, Alan Webber, and three new committee members, Angie Muscio, David Rose and Jon Tull.

Looking forward to our 2010/11 season, we have plenty to offer. From 13 to 16 October we present The Happiest Days of Your Life by John Dighton, a farce set at the end of the Second World War. The pupils and teachers of a South Coast girls' school (St Swithin's) are relocated to alternative accommodation as their own school has been a casualty of wartime bombing. Thanks to a bureaucratic mix-up, they wind up sharing the quarters of a boys' school (Hilary Hall) in Hampshire. The harried headmaster and headmistress, together with both sets of teachers, try to keep visiting parents from discovering the dilemma as the whole thing turns into a battle of the sexes. This play was first performed in 1948 at the Apollo Theatre in London and was followed by a film adaptation in 1950, which starred Alistair Sim, Margaret Rutherford as Miss Whitchurch and, in one of her best-remembered roles, Joyce Grenfell as Miss Gossage - one of the most unforgettable films ever. A hard act to follow but we are confident that Guy Hudson's chosen cast led by Peter Calver, Tony Goddard, Ann Lovell, Jo Silcox and Bob Wilson will ensure raucous laughter fills the theatre. We are also pleased to welcome two of our Young Players, India Castle-Gibb as Barbara and Jake Willis as Hopcroft Minor who join Laura Brand, Bill Penford, Catherine Webber, Duncan Browne, Dena Watts and Mike Rourke in their supporting roles.
