On May 25th 1923, the Surrey Mirror gave the first news of an exciting new project:-"It is proposed to erect a public hall for the service of Oxted and Limpsfield and surrounding parishes, to be known as the Barn Theatre. The project originated with the Oxted and Limpsfield Players, with whom the Crichton Dramatic Club was early associated. The two clubs, both of which are badly handicapped for the want of a suitable public hall in the district, appointed a joint committee which will be responsible for carrying the project through. Numerous meetings have been held, the best advice has been secured and it is confidently believed that the plans reach an ideal which has long been entertained by all of those who have practical experience of the difficulties of organising public and social functions in the district". The company was incorporated on 11th June 1923.

BARN NET ZERO PROJECT

The Barn has started a journey to Net Zero, this is being led by Phil Littleford with support from the Directors/Trustees. It all started when Phil attended a briefing by Tandridge District Council where the basics were explained with case studies from small local businesses and consultants/charities who are able to support. There was a raffle for all attendees with the prize being a voucher for £600 worth of consultancy support from Compare Your Footprint and Impact for Good. Unfortunately, Phil was not one of the lucky six prize winners but at the networking event later that evening he met Helen Hughes who is a big supporter of the Barn. Helen owns Meads B&B in Oxted and had won the voucher. She very kindly decided the voucher was of more use to the Barn than herself and donated it to Phil.

Phil has attended some training courses led by Surrey County Council and other organisations supporting work in this area. He has also had a number of meetings with the consultants and been trained on some software to enable us to measure our carbon footprint which will be completed during the autumn.

The reasons we are embarking on this journey -

- Get ahead of any enforced legislation from Government as a result of the commitments the UK made at COP26
- Financial it should deliver commercial benefits and a good return on investment
- Increase our business resilience

In November, New Aquarian Opera Company bring their first Grand Opera to the Barn Stage since the 2019 relaunch, with a fully staged production of Mozart's, The Marriage of Figaro.

This will be in English with an extraordinarily funny translation by Amanda Holden (not the BGT one) and we have an amazing cast of soloists, some of whom have performed with ENO, Irish National Opera and Glyndebourne. This will be a fully staged production of fours acts with a six piece Chamber Ensemble led by our musical director Guy Middlemiss. The show is 3 hours long, meaning we have to start at 7pm with two intervals to finish by 10:30



and tickets are ± 20 . There is still time for new members to join our chorus which is not too demanding in rehearsal time (for them).

The saga started in 1786 Vienna, when Mozart took a great risk by composing an opera from Beaumarchais' incendiary, banned play about servants outwitting their masters that literally changed the world of music forever. The Marriage of Figaro is a sublime operatic masterpiece of comedy, lust, deception, intrigue and love that remains the world's most favourite over 200 years later.

The story all takes place on Figaro and Susanna's wedding day; Figaro loves Susanna, the Countess still loves the Count, Cherubino loves all the ladies and as for the Count, love is not the word for how he feels about Susanna! As the Count schemes to get his wicked way, his Countess and the household plot to frustrate him with their own twists of fate and agendas. Mozart's unparalleled music sees the flaws of humanity laid bare, with a triumphant ending that is truly joyous.
