The first time I did lighting for a show and gained great interest was in 2004, three years ago. I got into this by talking to a neighbour, Martin Lloyd, who is also a theatre trustee and does lighting for the summer YOP's workshop. I have also helped Martin in lighting before helping him set up for the YOP's production. This is how I first took a liking to lighting. The performances I have lit are "Midsummer Nights Dream", "Animal Farm" and "Wickham's Wandering Oldetime Stagers". I have

also helped on a regular basis with setting up for various shows. These shows have been "The Crucible", "Christmas Cracker", "Aladdin", "Rip em off" and "Twelfth Night". My experience and confidence is getting better and better.

The amount of work that goes on beforehand in the Barn for lighting is amazing. When I first started I was shocked. Days, weeks or even months are spent setting up and lighting shows.
