

The Oxted Sessions triple-header at the Barn this March, with acts from both sides of the Atlantic, and even from down under...

The Oxted Sessions returns to the Barn Theatre this March — for the first time



since last April's knockout (and sold-out) show with Luke Haines (The Auteurs) and Peter Buck (R.E.M.) - with three top-quality evenings of live music from around the globe.

On Friday 3rd March, Oxted's very own The Karma Effect will be at the Barn for a very special home town show, one of their largest to date. The band have quickly made a name for themselves following the release of their first self-titled album, which made the official UK charts, and earned great reviews from the music press. The band is now hard at work on preparing their second release, with money raised from this show going directly towards funding that album. Expect a night of scintillating classic sounding rock 'n' roll – with some blues and soul thrown in for good measure - as the band deliver fan-favourites like 'Mercy', 'Steal Your Heart' and 'Wrong Again',

Then, on Monday 6th March, one of the biggest Oxted Sessions to date will see US indie rock royalty The Dream Syndicate kick-off their UK tour at the Barn. The remainder of the tour sees the band visit the usual major cities around the country, with Oxted being the only non-city on the tour map. And, for this tour only, the band will be joined by Vicki Peterson, founder member of The Bangles, on

lead guitar; while Matt Piucci and Steven Roback from The Dream Syndicate's fellow LA cult heroes Rain Parade will open the show. An absolute dream of a line-up (no pun intended...)

And, finally, on Monday 27th March, Alan Fletcher will bring his Australian-tinged country/folk music to the Barn, with fellow Aussie heavyweights Lachlan Bryan & The Wildes serving as his backing band. Alan is perhaps best known to people for his 28-year stint as Dr Karl Kennedy on the TV series Neighbours, but he is also an accomplished songwriter and musician, and has spent the past 18 months writing and recording his brand new album "The Point". This will be a wonderful night of songs and stories from two of Australia's finest - one for music fans and soap fanatics alike!

The new year got off to a busy start with 45 of our volunteers providing front of house cover for the 105 duties required for TOPs near sell-out production of *Cinderella*. Thanks, as always, to those who gave their time so freely, and for the fact that the rota had almost


been completely filled several weeks before the production even started! The next couple of months are also looking extremely busy with no fewer than 25 performances to cover before the end of March, so do please let us know if you are able to spare even a little of your time.

At the start of 2022 we took the decision to try to become as cashless a venue as we could and since then have encouraged our patrons to make front of house payments by card whenever possible. With the recent announcement that the two most local branches of NatWest, with whom we bank, are about to close, thereby limiting where cash receipts can be deposited, we are having to take this one step further and advise that from 1st March 2023 all payments at the theatre may only be made by credit or debit card. In addition to card payments being easier to administer, they are also quicker to transact than cash payments, and are safer than having hundreds, sometimes thousands, of pounds on the premises.

The date for this year's FOBs AGM has been set for Tuesday 28th February, and all current members will shortly be receiving an official invitation along with an agenda. Membership fees became due on 1st January, and anyone wishing to renew their membership (or become a member for the first time) should please do so prior to the AGM.

CMVC Music director, Matthew Quinn



Matthew comes from Belfast and at the dauntingly young age of 25 (when he joined CMVC) has already built a remarkable music biography. He has worked with such top-quality ensembles as the RTE Concert Orchestra, Crouch End Festival Chorus and the Lux Chamber Choir. He has conducted Northern Ireland Opera, the Genesis Sixteen and the Queen's University Chamber Choir. He was previously

Music Director of the Manchester Philharmonic Choir and the Hallam Choral Society. He is an accomplished singer and has performed as a soloist in pieces such as The Armed Man by Karl Jenkins and Mozart's The Magic Flute. He has also coached the Northern Ireland Opera, the Halle Orchestra and the Belfast School of Performing Arts.

Samuel Prouse was born in London, and is a prize-winning postgraduate student of the Royal Academy of Music (Alan Kirby Prize), where he pursued choral conducting and organ studies with Patrick Russill and Paul Brough. During this time, Samuel held organist posts at St Marylebone Parish Church and

Westminster Abbey.

While still a student, Samuel became a Fellow of the Royal College of Organists, winning prizes for the highest marks in the practical examination, and the Dixon Prize for Improvisation. He has given solo recitals at Westminster Abbey, Westminster Cathedral, St Paul's Cathedral and York Minster, as well as concert performances in France, Germany, Italy, Latvia, Malta and St John's, Smith Square in London.

Samuel was Head Chorister at St Edmundsbury Cathedral in Suffolk and read Music at Royal Holloway College, University of London, where he was also Organ Scholar. He is a keen composer and has had his choral compositions performed by the BBC Singers, the London Symphony Chorus and Siglo de Oro.

Samuel has appeared as an accompanist, composer and conductor on a number of recordings for labels such as Delphian Records, Naxos, Signum and Regent Records. He has also performed on radio broadcasts in the UK and on Radio France Culture. He previously accompanied the CMVC on an occasional basis, and became the full-time accompanist in September 2022.


stories, with lots of laughter along the way. And the chance to ask your questions too. All sprinkled with some choice memories of appearing at the Barn Theatre over the years.
