We began our 2008/9 season with the tenth anniversary of our very popular Young Players Summer Workshop with David Rowan. After a week of preparation and rehearsals, 40 youngsters gave an excellent performance of David's adaptation of *The Lion The Witch and the Wardrobe* on the Saturday night to an audience of family and friends, assisted on the technical side by more Young Players. Because of the success of these workshops, we have persuaded David come back again during the February half term week.

We have also just completed our run of *Benefactors* by Michael Frayn which, although not well attended, was very well received by its audiences. This play replaced the originally planned *Anniversary* which we had to abandon due to casting problems. The cast of Nicky Gill, Chris Morgan, Alan Webber and David Fanthorpe under the direction of Peter Shore gave very creditable performances coping with the very wordy script. With no guidance from the author as to staging the play, which spanned a period of some 15 years, Peter and his helpers produced a simple set design which was very effectively enhanced by the lighting by Richard Grogan. We compliment Peter, his cast and crew for their commitment to the production and on the end result.

Our January Pantomime rehearsals are now well underway, benefiting from the experienced direction of Neil Reynolds and excellent choreography by Fran Reynolds. This family pantomime is a refreshing new take on the old legend of Robin Hood and his followers, *The Merry Men*, and the evil *Prince John* (John Harris) and the even eviller Sheriff of Nottingham (Chris Bassett). Add an outrageous Dame by the name of Jemima Gusset (Clive MacTavish), lively dances and well known songs you have a hilarious mix of fun, music and adventure. There is a variation on the usual formula as our principal boy is exactly that! Robin Hood is played by new member Peter Calver and Laura Brand returns as principal girl as Maid Marian. With the support of Will Scarlett (Nigel Brown), Little John (Jonathan Tull) and Friar Tuck (David Rose) and joined by Gymkhana Thatch (Sophie MacTavish) Robin has a cunning plan to rescue Maid Marian who has been kidnapped by the Sheriff and in true panto style there is a happy outcome.

Robin Hood and His Merry Men runs from 9 to 17 January 2009 (excluding 12 and 13 January) with ten performances in all including 5 matinees/late afternoon slots. The first performance on 9

We are again supporting the Southern Counties Festival in February 2009 by entering two one-act plays, our Adult Entry being directed by Peter Reed and the Youth Entry by June Brown. Our 2008 Festival Play by our Young Players scooped a total of 6 awards at The Barn and at Walton whilst our Adult Entry won the Adjudicator's Award at The Barn so we will aiming to do well again next year.

There is also real excitement and interest in our May production which will be a traditional version of Shakespeare's comedy, *Much Ado About Nothing.* We are pleased to welcome Paul Longhurst who will be well known to many theatre goers both at The Barn and in the South East where he has appeared in and directed many musicals and plays. He directed the Barnstormers' much acclaimed production of *The Crucible* and also the two musicals *Into the Woods* and, more recently, *The Scarlet Pimpernel*, both of which went down to the Minack Theatre in Cornwall The play is set in *Messina* where it has been a busy week! A jilted bride - innocent of her supposed crimes, a "love trap" set to end a long standing battle of words, the incompetent night-watchmen make an arrest while a bastard brother makes plans for a prince's downfall. What went wrong? Well, take care that you don't believe everything you overhear! This is classic Shakespeare comedy.

There will be a read through of the play on Tuesday 25 November 2008 in the Little Barn behind the Barn Theatre at 8.00 p.m. and auditions on Sunday 30 November 2008 at Hurst Green Community Centre (behind the shops), Pollards Oak Road, Hurst Green at 5.00pm.
